Total G.E. units required are 51 and $\nabla 9$ of these G.E. units must be upper division (i.e., courses numbered 100-199). These $\nabla 9$ upper division G.E. units can be taken no sooner than the term in which 60 units of coursework are completed (including courses in G.E., major, minor, electives, etc.). These $\nabla 9$ units must include 6 units from CAPSTONE. The remaining $\nabla 3$ upper division units are normally selected from a BREADTH division although a third CAPSTONE class orPISi 101 from CORE may be used.
