1. School Accomplishments

The table above documents graduation for Liberal Studies, Kremen's only undergraduate program, and the rate already exceeds the 2025 goal for full time first time freshmen (FTFTF) graduation rate. Likewise, the transfer student graduation rate already exceeds the aspirational goal. The Freshman Achievement Gap numbers are highly variable. Three years ago the Pell students performed better than the comparison group. The gap jumped from .0% to 10.5% in one year. Since nothing changed, we expect it will drop back down next year.

The high graduation rates compared to the rest of campus are likely due our centralized Center for Advising and Student Services that provides both intrusive and personalized advising so the students are clear on their pathway to graduation. This model is being emulated elsewhere in the University.

These figures are misleading however as to the effectiveness of the program in preparing the candidates for a career in teaching, which is the goal of the major. With all the courses controlled by the various departments across the University and with over 70% taught by part time instructors, there is no fidelity to the syllabi and students are not sufficiently prepared to be admitted to the credential program despite the high graduation rate. As a result the majority of graduates are unable to pass the entrance examination for the credential program in Multiple Subjects, the California Subject Matter Exam for Teachers –MS. We are aggressively pursuing a correction to this situation.

We have just finished the first year of an anticipated four-year process to re-imagine the Liberal Studies majors for teaching. We have hired the first three full time Liberal Studies faculty to be in the to-be-created Liberal Studies Department. Additionally, two new and one current educational technology faculty will be moved to Liberal Studies. Field experience in schools

will accompany some courses. Instructors are receiving stipends to undergo training to infuse pedagogy into the content classes and course syllabi are being overhauled to ensure they contain the content necessary to be a teacher and to pass the exam. The various Deans and Department Chairs are expected to cooperate in assigning instructors to cohorts and with scheduling of the learning community classes.

1.2. New Hires in Kremen School

The Kremen School conducted 7 searches during 2015-16. One failed and will be repeated next year.

Kremen was successful in filling 7 tenure track positions. We hired two faculty for one search in counseling in that both were highly qualified and fluent in Spanish, a pressing need in the department because nearly half of the counseling sessions at Fresno Family Counseling take place in Spanish. To supervise the students there, it is necessary to have Spanish-speaking faculty.

We were successful in further diversifying our faculty, five of seven new tenure track faculty were from underrepresented groups including two Hispanics, two Asians, and one African American. In the last 13 years of tenure track hiring, Kremen has added 57 faculty, 30 from underrepresented groups and 25 who are white/non Hispanic.

1.3 Faculty/Staff Development

Kremen encouraged and funded faculty to pursue professional development at conferences pertaining to their expertise at local, national, and international levels. As a result, 51 faculty members participated in 34 local conferences, 40 faculty members participated in national conferences, ranging from 1-6 conferences for each faculty; and 9 faculty members participated in 1-2 international conferences.

Kremen sent 10 new faculty members to attend the 4th CLEAR Mentoring Summit in October 2015 to enhance their mentoring experience. On October 22, 2015, Fresno County Office of Education, Fresno Pacific University and CVELI hosted our 6th annual teaching excellence

conference. The keynote speakers, Bob Marzano and Darrell Scott, focused on how leaders create school cultures that can help awaken students' passion for learning. Eleven Kremen faculty attended.

Five Walk-through visits were conducted with Fresno Unified School District for our faculty to have direct observation of K-12 classes and discussion with school administrators and teachers about the best practice in teacher education. This is a better professional activity than almost any conference or imported speaker.

Five faculty went to Cuba in March 2016 visiting schools and learning about the cultural characteristics of Cuba.

A fall Faculty Colloquium was conducted in Oct, 2015 and a spring 2016 Research Colloquium in April. Faculty receiving research grants presented to their peers and students their research projects.

Aside from Administrative release time, faculty in Kremen received assigned time for research, paid by the University, and assigned time for research, reimbursed through grants. The total WTUs in those two categories are shown by department and overall in the table below. As may be seen, Faculty received 159 WTUs to pursue their research and service projects for the past academic year.

1.4 Reserves

The Kremen School reserve at the end of this fiscal year is anticipated to be of **\$132,276**. This small reserve was only made possible because we entered the year with a \$558,069 reserve and the Provost provided a \$500,000 augmentation. This means the minimum underpayment to Kremen by the Budget formula was (\$925,793) for this year. That figure is however misleading. Each year the Doctoral Program in Education Leadership pays approximately \$200,000 of salary for faculty teaching other courses than those in the doctoral program. Over the last three years, CalStateTEACH has paid for over \$200,000 of equipment costs for the school and the doctoral program provided a \$100,000 supplement to our budget.

The budgets of CalStateTEACH and the Doctoral Program are fenced and not part of Kremen School money. Obviously the Provost cannot continue to supplement us by \$500,000 per year. Any reserves we show are an artificial figure. The Budget Formula does not work for Kremen. No one can explain why or how to remediate it. This year we funded no international travel, held no school wide conferences at school expense, spent no Kremen funds on release time for research, and had administrative release time less than the 12% target. We were going to cancel

the graduate reception the school has always held prior to our convocation, however a donor stepped in to save it. Next year we are further cutting travel, reducing student assistants, increasing class size to the 125% level where possible, the formula will still not allow us to operate.

1.5 Fundraising

Fundraising in Academic Affairs comes from two sources, development and grants/contracts. Development had a disappointing year while grants in particular were quite successful.

The Kremen **Development office** brought in only \$477,202 to date for the fiscal year. This is \$1.5 million under the average of the previous three years, though our four-year average, still has a strong mean of \$1.3 million. Such a reduction may reflect the limitations in staffing due to personal leaves.

Grant activity for the year was particularly valuable, producing **\$2.5 million**, most of it of direct benefit to our students and their reparation. This figure does not include the \$8 million Fresno Teacher Residency grant, written by Colleen Torgerson but housed at Fresno Unified or the just announced \$1.2 million Bechtel Foundation grant written by Cathy Yun with support from Lisa Bennett, Fred Nelson, and Colleen Torgerson, or three grants written by Nancy Ahkavan in collaboration with Porterville to benefit that partnership. This new Bechtel grant will expand our residency work to Sanger and Central and develop a professional development school in Fresno. It will also allow us to continue the summer training for faculty teaching in Liberal Studies and credential programs.

Particularly pleasing this year is the large number of Primary Investigators who received external grants/contacts, as opposed to them being developed by just a few different individuals five or six years ago. The list, followed by the number of different grants funded, includes: Colleen Torgerson (3), Albert Valencia (1), Christian Wandeler (1), Cathy Yun (3), Steve Price (10), Janelle Pitt (1), Fred Nelson (1), Jim Marshall (3), Chris Lucey (1), Cheryl Caldera (2), Juliet Wahleithner (1), Sherry Cruz (4), Virginia Boris (8), Carol Bohlin (2), Nancy Ahkavan (3), and Paul Beare (1).

2. Professional Accomplishments/MPP Evaluation

2.a Top Five Challenges and Opportunities

2.a.1 Induction of 14 new full time faculty

2015-16 saw 14 new, full time faculty joining the Kremen School, an amazing number for any school or college. They have had an outstanding experience, at least according to them. Along with having carefully chosen mentors, Ken Magdaleno, Sarah Lam, and Paul Beare met with them on a monthly basis for a lunch. Initially Sarah and Paul picked the topics but by the end of the first semester the group had bonded and they were stating what they wanted discussed or covered.

At the last meeting, May 18, each new faculty prepared one Ppt. slide that included what they felt was their biggest achievement, three things they learned, and their greatest challenge. Almost all said the cohort of colleagues was invaluable and how they could depend on them.

One of the 14, who was a full time lecturer, was hired for a tenure track slot. They all presented at conferences, many got involved in grant writing, a few bought houses here (a good sign to us) and four had babies. Monica Billen's husband was hired for a tenure track position in Agriculture, another good sign for skilled people staying.

This is the first time we attempted this cohort mentoring approach. We will repeat it next year for the nine new hires starting in August.

2.a.2 California Teacher Shortage

CSU enrolled and credentialed *three times as many* teacher candidates in 2001-02 as it does today. (28,656 teachers prepared in 2001-02; 8,837 teachers prepared in 2014-15). This reduction in enrollments was most dramatic during the recession and the period of severe school district budget cuts and teacher lay-offs. This reduction was *found in all teacher preparation sectors* in the state, both public and private. The state now faces a major teacher shortage. This year, school districts project the need to hire 21,500 teachers in California. All credential programs prepared 13,300 candidates the previous year, leaving a *shortfall of over 8,000 newly trained teachers* to take available positions. The result is the hiring of individuals without credentials who are allowed to be employed in temporary positions through a mechanism the state created for severe shortages (i.e., so-called *emergency credentials*). The shortage of teachers during the next three years is projected at *over 25,000*. Subject areas of acute need are in math, science, and special education with all projected shortages of *more than 2,000 teachers each year*.

In 2014-2015 Fresno State produced more teachers than any other CSU or UC, and more than any other single campus university, trailing only National Universities on-line program. Those students were all employed immediately. This year's graduates' employment is remarkable. At our Teacher Fair, virtually all received multiple job offers and many received signing bonuses of \$5000 or more.

We do not have a final number yet on the number of credential completers for this academic year, they will be applying for credentials for most of the summer. Last year's number was 446, this year the comparable number so far is 512 that have applied for teaching credentials. In addition 81 completed administrative credentials and 40 school counseling.

Of last year's completers, 83 held intern credentials, meaning they were employed as teacher of record prior to taking student teaching. This is far from the ideal situation we hope to see but an inevitable solution to a shortage crisis. We project this year intern number to be over 100.

This spring we sent letters or met in person with 670 Fresno State faculty outside of Education and requested they provide us names for students they feel would be good teachers. To date we have received 121 referrals. We are contacting those candidates and inviting them to an event scheduled for July 29.

2.a.3 Liberal Studies Reimagining

We have just completed the first year of the Liberal Studies Reimagining Our work in re-imagining the Liberal Studies program, the second largest undergraduate major at Fresno State, began in the summer of 2015 with a collaboration among faculty from the Kremen School of Education and Human Development, the College of Arts and Humanities, the College of Science and Mathematics, and the College of Social Sciences. These eighteen faculty worked with local K-8 teachers in the first Liberal Studies Summer Academy to unpack the key knowledge, skills, and dispositions of preservice teachers relevant to specific disciplines, such as literacy, science, social science, and mathematics. Faculty also considered the influence of *Common Core State Standards* and the *Next Generation Science Standards* and addressed the importance of the development of Pedagogical Content Knowledge in their curricular decisions. From this work came a set of undergraduate course offerings in Liberal Studies with explicit attention to the learning of future elementary teachers, with relevant learning experiences connected to practice:

- ENGL 117W--Writing for the K-8 Teacher
- SSCI 110--California Studies
- COMM 114--Communication and Learning
- LING 132--Linguistics and Reading
- MATH 100--Exploring Mathematics
- NSCI 115--Intro to Environmental Earth and Life Science
- SSCI 180--Diversity in the US

Using external funds, we provided each student with a tablet, enabling them to also become part of DISCOVER-e. Planning is in place for the summer 2016 two-week faculty development, with new instructors recruited. Those instructors will teach classes to incoming transfer students fall16.

Five new tenure track faculty were hired to be part of the Liberal Studies Department that will be proposed this year. The group includes subject matter experts in writing, science, and universal design along with two technology oriented faculty. Fred Nelson and Libbi Miller will also

become part of that department, providing the seven tenure track faculty required by the APM. Nicole Walsh is a full time lecturer with an Ed.D. and may also be assigned to that department, when it is formed. With Wayfinders transferring their offices to a larger location, it frees up ED 151 to serve as the department office. The receptionist currently in ED 100 has started working as staff to the reimagined program and will move across the hall as staff to Liberal Studies when that move occurs, likely July 2017. The move of Wayfinders frees up three small internal offices in ED 151 that will serve as the faculty office of the chair and two of the faculty. Those rooms are not classified as faculty offices but will serve the purpose of giving Liberal Studies students a home, an identity, and an excellent use of the space.

The project was presented to the President's Commission on Teacher Education in September 2015, and identified these goals for moving forward:

- Build and sustain a responsive, innovative, and bold Liberal Studies Department;
- Engage faculty who are invested in LS students and the preparation of teachers;
- Provide ongoing comprehensive support for future teachers; and
- Institutionalize infrastructure to support innovation.

Candidates expressed interest in coming to Fresno State based on this innovative emphasis on the cultural and linguistic diversity of our learners. These searches resulted in the hiring of three dynamic new faculty members from some of the most recognized doctoral programs in the country.

The first cohort of classes in the program took place in the spring, with faculty in dedicated sections of SSC110, ENGL117W, COMM114, and LING132 sharing the same thirty Liberal Studies majors in a unique schedule meeting on Tuesdays & Thursdays. A significant problem identified early in our project was the lack of a sense of belonging for Liberal Studies majors in this dispersed, interdepartmental major, as this student articulated:

“I wish the program had a sense of community where I had networking opportunities and meaningful relationships.”

For the first cohort in the spring, we instituted an orientation and team-building event with a pizza party, scavenger hunt, and Fresno State ropes course challenge. The effectiveness of this model in establishing a community of learners was powerful, as evidenced by these comments from faculty who collaborated in the Liberal Studies Summer Academy:

“I am much more aware of what our students are expected to do as teachers in elementary schools. I consider that now explicitly when I design classes.”

“We look at the expectations of common core and try to raise awareness of what the districts will expect them to do.”

“I look forward to seeing how students develop a sense of community when they are in the same cohort, and I will be talking to other STEP faculty across disciplines to see what they do in their classes.”

For fall 2016, four exclusive cohort schedules have been developed, with capacity for 120 transfer and native Fresno State Liberal Studies students. This innovative schedule was designed with the assistance of Anne Burkholder in the Scheduling Office and Undergraduate Dean Xuanning Fu, allowing our advisors to provide a “reserved seat” in cohort courses for our students. We meet frequently with Deans, Department Chairs, and faculty from departments across the university to share our message of the need for a dedicated undergraduate effort in teacher education. In this summer’s Liberal Studies Summer Academy, fifteen Liberal Studies faculty will collaborate with nine local K-8 teachers to re-imagine their courses. A major focus for this summer will be the integration of content across courses in the cohorts. Another emphasis will be the development of meaningful field-based learning experiences in these local K-8 classrooms, a need revealed by this student comment:

“While obtaining undergraduate Liberal Studies degree, it would’ve been beneficial to observe in primary/secondary classrooms so that we would have experience prior to the credential program.”

The membership of the Liberal Studies Review Committee was revised to now include faculty representing each college who actually teach courses in the major. A significant problem identified early in our project was the lack of a sense of belonging for Liberal Studies majors in this dispersed, interdepartmental major, as this student articulated:

“I wish the program had a sense of community where I had networking opportunities and meaningful relationships.”

With the assistance of Vice Provost Dennis Nef and Undergraduate Dean Xuanning Fu, we are proceeding with the establishment of a Liberal Studies Department. We are proposing a new course with a Liberal Studies prefix, LS110, which focuses on Writing for the K-8 classroom.

We have been very active in recruiting students to join the cohorts. We have made over ten presentations to different groups about the new program, including students from West Hills College Lemoore, Clovis West High School, Fresno Unified Teacher Academies, and Preview Days. We have also developed and presented a webinar for students guiding them through the unique registration process for joining a Liberal Studies cohort.

Collaboration with Undergraduate Dean Xuanning Fu is ongoing in the program, which plans to cohort and assign all new Liberal Studies Freshmen to learning communities beginning fall 2017. This will be the first major to do so on campus and should improve the four and six year Liberal Studies graduation rates, already the highest on campus.

The purpose of the reimagining is, of course, to improve instruction and preparation of the undergraduate students. Because only one semester of the program has been offered, there is no quantitative data yet available.

2.a.4 Funding

Kremen utilizes the all funds possible approach to operation. We use grant funds, and endowment money to cover basic operating, not just the funds generated through the budget formula. We also extensively use funds from DPELFS and CalStateTEACH, funds not available to Education school and colleges on other campuses. Other campuses do not have the collaborative working agreement between these two fenced programs as can be found at Fresno State.

Kremen uses no more administrative time than other schools and colleges. Kremen spends more on supervision and teaching travel. The former is necessary to any education program. The latter is somewhat larger because of our model of teaching and administration credential programs being offered on site in schools. That in turn however frees up significant classroom space on our crowded campus, eases campus parking to a small degree, and hugely improves the quality of our instruction.

After three years, the revised budget formula has under-funded Kremen by essentially \$1,000,000 per year. If we had started with no carry-forward, not taken money from DPELFS, CalStateTEACH, or the Provost, we would currently be around \$3,000,000 in the red.

Under the old budget formula, we were carrying a \$1.2 million surplus. No one can explain why. The best guess is that supervision, which leads to a large number of sections producing

very few FTES is the culprit. We prepare professionals, that is all we do. In the future, we will offer four courses in the Liberal Studies major, but still no GE, no opportunity for large classes at low cost. This fall we are maximizing enrollment in course sections to 125% to see if that makes a difference.

There is nothing else Kremen can do. For 10 years, as soon as we gained a carryforward, the Senate Budget Committee and the budget managers at that time told us we were overfunded. We weathered two prior formula changes to reduce our income. This third one cannot however be beaten. We see no way that next year can be effectively handled and still prepare teachers, counselors, and school leaders, that is, professionals. We produce 40% of the campus's masters degrees and within three years will be up to over 50% of the doctoral degrees. We are not the same as the other schools and colleges and funding us on the same basis does not work.

2.a.5 Partnerships with the Community

We have a number of very meaningful and valuable partnerships with the community. Details are included in our annual Ancillary Report. Community partnerships are valuable to students, the education community, and the central valley in general. The following partnerships showcase the accomplishments we have made in this year:

Central Valley Partnership for Exemplary Teachers

The Kremen School CPET was recognized by AASCU and earned the prestigious Crista McAuliffe Award in September 2014 and the Urban Teacher Residency United (UTR) published a manuscript entitled *Clinically Oriented Teacher Preparation* in Summer 2015 highlighting Fresno State throughout the monograph. Faculty have been asked to present at AASCU, TECSCU, AACTE, Irvine Grant meetings, and California's Educators Excellence Summit. The National Center for Teacher Residencies visited Fresno State, Fresno Unified, and Sanger Unified in 2016 and will publish a new monograph sharing Fresno area partnerships in summer 2016.

In the 2015-16 academic year the Kremen School continued their partnership preparation of teachers and administrators. This approach to clinical preparation is supported in research, through accreditation and professional organizations, and through data collected from our graduates. The partnerships included: 8 in Multiple Subject (Sanger, Clovis, Central [ECE] and FUSD [3]); 4 in Single Subject (Clovis, Madera, Porterville, and Fresno); and 8 educational administration cohorts (Fresno, Visalia, Central, Kings Canyon...). These partnerships included courses on-site, fieldwork placements in the district whenever possible, and for some classes the district's lens or a co-teaching arrangement.

Funding for CPET has included \$900,000 for the first year from the Bechtel Foundation, \$8.9 million for the Fresno Teacher Residency aspect from the Department of Education, and most recently, \$1.2 million from Bechtel for forming professional development schools in Sanger and Central, and deepening our partnership with Fresno. Notification of this award was received the last week in May and has not been made public yet. Three grants have been funded in

partnership with Porterville/Tulare County to facilitate recruitment and the development of Linked Learning pedagogy.

Central Valley Educational Leadership Institute (CVELI)

CVELI was formed in 2002 by then President John Welty with the mission of supporting educational leaders in the Central Valley of their efforts to eliminate the achievement gap and improve the learning outcomes of all students. His vision for CVELI was to bring the resources of the University to the educational leaders of the University's nine-county service region. In March 2016, the CSU Board of Trustees officially renamed CVELI; on August 8, 2016, Kremen School of Education will honor Dr. John Welty and Dr. Sharon Brown Welty and celebrate the new *John D. Welty Center for Educational Policy and Leadership*.

The center this year operated five major projects: the Rural Network, Cohort Three of the Middle Leaders Program, Leadership Team Training, Lead Teacher Training, and the Exemplary School Conference. Fresno Unified has a \$280,000/year coaching contract with CVELI. The Cowell Foundation funded its work to the tune of \$100,000 this year.

Goals**Department of Counselor Education and Rehabilitation****1. Report on previous years goals.**

- a) Two new tenured track faculty (bilingual in English and Spanish) were hired to assist with teaching Counselor Education courses and Fresno Family Counseling Center.
- b) The Rehabilitation Program is continuing to recruit and restructuring the program for COHORT admittance and CACREP accreditation.
- c) We continue to uphold the standards of our programs and the professional counseling fields by evaluating our students' knowledge, skills and dispositions in Clinical Reviews and COMP Exams.
- d) The Rehabilitation Program is now named Clinical Rehabilitation and Mental Health Counseling.

2. Continued goals from previous years.**3. New goals.****Department of Curriculum and Instruction****1. Report on previous years goals.**

- a) Welcome to the department and support new faculty. Dr. Mariya Yukhymenko and Dr. Emy Lopez Phillips were welcomed and efforts were made to ensure their smooth transition to university life in Fresno. These efforts were largely successful.
- b) Conducting successful searches for three tenure track positions in Liberal Studies STEM, Technology and Curriculum, and INTERESC Director and Technology. Drs. Carol Fry Bohlin, Joe Parks and Otto Benavides headed up the respective search committees and each committee finished its work. The result was that offers were made to the following candidates: Myung Shin accepted the Liberal Studies STEM position; Dr. Emy Lopez Phillips accepted the Instruction and Technology position, and, Trang Phan has accepted the position as INTERESC Director.
- c) Work to make research proficiency more central to the KSOEHD graduate programs in education. Dr. Susan Tracz and the ERE faculty created and forwarded a new Certificate of Advanced Study in Research Methods. This 15-unit program covers a variety of research methodologies used in education and other fields and is designed to enable graduates to design and implement research studies and otherwise meeting the research needs of the organizations they serve.

2. Continued goals from previous years.

- a) Support the university's SUCCESS Initiative by expanding the role of UNIV 1 and offering it in both Fall and Spring semesters and encouraging more freshman students to take it. Both Dr. Kim Cole and Jacques Benninga served on SUCCESS Task Force committees to advocate for UNIV 1. A research component will be added to the UNIV 1 effort in 2016-17 to assess its impact on graduation rates (Drs. Cole and Wandeler).
- b) Continued implementation of the Co-Teaching model through workshops and training (conducted by Drs. Pham and Lomeli) and through supervision of student teachers (coordinated by Janine Quisenberry). A research component will be added to the co-teaching effort in 2016 to assess its impact on our programs.
- c) The combination of new hires and old inspirations has increased both the number of refereed presentations and refereed publications. These are reflected in the data below. Particular kudos to Lisa Nyberg, Libbi Miller, Mariya Yukhymenko and Christian Wandeler for their excellent publications and to Wally Ullrich for having his MAT selected as one of the top online MA programs in the United States.
- d) Support professional development for all faculty. For the most part, we were able to support faculty requests professional travel funding in 2015-16. Predicted budgetary constraints for 2016-2017 may require closer evaluation and will be discussed by department faculty in that year.
- e) Continue the warm, efficient atmosphere in the departmental office; hold productive, issue-oriented departmental meetings; serve family-style lunches at department meetings. The departmental office is served by a highly efficient, caring DAA (Martha Lomeli) and student assistants trained by her to be faculty and student-centered. The work of the office and the faculty in the department is handled efficiently and in a very friendly manner.
- f) Encourage collaborations with local and P-16 agencies to address the educational needs of students and the community.

3. New goals.

Department of Educational Leadership

1. Report on previous years goals.

- a) *Continue to develop the Higher Education, Administration, and Leadership (HEAL) master's degree pathway with a focus on developing HEAL as its own option within the Department of Educational Leadership.*
 - The following three areas highlight the continuing efforts to develop the HEAL degree pathway as an Option within the Department of Educational Leadership: HEAL recruitment and yield, curriculum, and the establishment of a graduate student association.
 - *HEAL Recruitment & Yield:* Recruitment efforts for the HEAL pathway were driven by the intention to reach the Dean's enrollment target of 20 students. To reach this goal, an intentional recruitment plan was developed to promote the HEAL pathway and seek a robust pool of applicants. First, a mini-grant was secured through the Division of Graduate Studies providing some monetary support for recruitment

- events. The funds were secured to design, organize, and execute a large month long event called Careers in Student Affairs Month, which is a national effort with the support of NASPA, a leading professional association in higher education. HEAL faculty, in collaboration with HEAL graduate students, and the Division of Student Affairs & Enrollment Management brought this month long event for the first time to Fresno State. Four CSAM events throughout the month of October yielded more than 100 participants, all of which received information about the HEAL pathway.
- Information Sessions: Two information sessions were hosted this year; one at Fresno State and another at UC Merced. The information sessions provided an opportunity for prospective applicants to hear from HEAL faculty and current HEALers about the program. Over 50 people attended the sessions. Data collected from those events showed many in attendance applied for Fall 2016 admission.
 - As a result of these efforts 25 applications were received for the April 1st priority deadline. From this group of applicants, 24 have confirmed their enrollment for the fall term. As of the submission of this report, two additional applications were received for the June 1st deadline. HEAL has reached the Dean's target enrollment goal for fall 2016 thus highlighting the interest and need for the HEAL degree pathway to become an option.
 - *Curriculum*: Ongoing efforts have been completed to ensure HEAL curriculum is aligned with the principles of good practice and professional competency areas advanced by the leading professions in the field (NASPA, ACPA, and ASHE) in higher education and student affairs.
 - *Higher Education, Administration, & Leadership Graduate Student Association (HGSA)*: The continued maturation of the degree pathway this year involved the establishment of a graduate student association. During this academic year, students organized themselves with the guidance of their HEAL faculty advisors to draft a constitution and by-laws which were formally approved by the student government (Associated Students Inc.). HGSA secured \$7,500 from an Instructional Related Activities (IRA) grant. This substantial funding source provided the monies necessary for HEAL graduate students to attend the NASPA annual conference in Indiana, an important professional development opportunity for professionals in working in higher education. The NASPA annual conference also served as a recruitment and promotional venue for HEAL.
- b) *Continue work on the development of a Department of Educational Leadership vision and mission as well as create a new SOAP to reflect new student learning outcomes and assessments in alignment with newly adopted California Program Standards, Content Expectations and Performance Expectations for a Preliminary Administrative Credential Preparation Program and changes to the HEAL pathway.*
- Over the course of the 2015 – 2016 year a new department mission and values were established for the department. During the Educational Leadership department retreat at the beginning of the 2015-16 academic, Dr. Susana Hernández and Dr. Ignacio Hernández, facilitated a session of department faculty to identify our core values. From this initial session, three subsequent activities were designed and used in department meetings during the fall 2015 semester. As a result of these sessions, a new mission statement was generated and unanimously approved by all department

faculty members. The mission reflects the shared values and principles of the two pathways (PreK-12 Leadership and HEAL) within the Department of Educational Leadership. The SOAP continues to be a work in progress as the K-12 pathway transitions to the new California Administrator Performance Expectations and Content Expectations and HEAL focuses on the development of HEAL as its own option within the Department of Educational Leadership.

- c) *Continue effective recruitment methods and expand and sustain strong district partnerships.*
- Recruitment efforts for both pathways have produced positive results. The PreK-12 pathway operates six cohorts throughout the Central Valley in partnership with six districts: Central, Clovis, Fresno, Kings Canyon (Reedley), Sanger and Visalia with a yield of 141 students enrolled in fall 2015. HEAL operates two cohorts with a yield of 29 students enrolled in fall 2015. Total fall 2015 enrollment was 170 graduate students of which 157 stated a race/ethnicity and 13 unknown. Of the 157 students, diverse candidates are enrolled (60% non-White of which 51% are Hispanic, 40% White, 4% African American, 2% Asian and 3% Other).
 - See *HEAL Recruitment & Yield (a)* above for additional information on recruitment efforts and yield for fall 2016. Four Information Sessions were held in K-12 districts during the 2015-16 academic year. Final yield is not yet available as candidates are still applying, however, it appears that the yield could be the highest enrollment in the past ten years.
- d) *Develop one system (to include, but not limited to one specific set of expectations/learning outcomes, analytic rubric, and candidate follow-up and support documents), bringing together two distinct pathways (PreK-12 and HEAL/representing P-16), for the Graduate Writing Competency for Educational Leaders.*
- Faculty from the Department of Educational Leadership submitted a proposal in May 2015 for an OIE Assessment Grant. The purpose of the grant was to support faculty work of improving the Department of Educational Leadership's assessment of graduate students' learning in the **written communication core competency area**. In particular, the proposal sought funding to support department faculty in their commitment to develop (a) clear learning outcomes related to graduate-level writing, (b) curricular alignment, (c) a sustainable assessment plan, and (d) program improvement bringing together both pathways (PreK-12 and HEAL/representing P-16). Emphasis on the written communication core competency area was relevant and timely for the department because of projected enrollment growth and focus on educational leaders across the P-16 pipeline. The proposal was awarded with an OIE Assessment Grant for the 2015-16 academic year and this initial foundational work will be completed by June 2016.
- e) *Develop digital modules and revise handbook for EAD 298/Master's Project to provide more comprehensive, consistent support to master's candidates among and between pathways.*
- Over the course of the 2015-16 academic year, much progress was made to strengthen and provide more comprehensive, consistent support to master's candidates

completing a project as their culminating experience. Focus was on developing clear and consistent language around the EAD 298 project. As a result of discussions between both pathways, revisions were completed to the EAD 298 Handbook. Revisions included the renaming of the culminating experience to Master's Degree Research Project or MDRP. More up to date language around the applied component and greater clarity on the research component of the culminating experience were also added. Faculty discussion and collaboration throughout the year ensured greater alignment between Educational Research & Evaluation (ERE) courses and the master's culminating experience.

- An EAD 298/Project syllabus and Blackboard site was also developed and piloted by Dr. Susana Hernández in the spring 2016. The syllabus and digital platform allows for a more comprehensive and consistent support to master's candidates among and between degree pathways. A second pilot of EAD 298 syllabus and Blackboard will be conducted in the fall of 2016.

f) *Write a new program to new CTC Clear Induction Standards and updated CPSELS, and complete an Initial Program Review to receive program approval to grant California Clear Administrative Services Credentials.*

- After deeper examination and review of the requirements to submit a new program to grant a California Clear Administrative Services Credential and much faculty discussion, it was decided that writing a new program was not the best use of University resources (time, talent, and energy of faculty) and that there was other more important and high leverage work that requires the focus of faculty. The revisions made to the requirements to acquire a California Clear Administrative Services Credential no longer link program requirements with University units of credit. The Educational Leadership faculty will work with districts and LEAs as a partner to support our graduates of the Preliminary Administrative Services Credential as they assume leadership and administrative roles.

- a) *Continue the PreK-12 Academic Task Force's cycle of review work: review, revise and create (as needed) competency and foundation course tasks in alignment with the newly adopted and recently revised California Program Standards, Content Expectations and Performance Expectations for a Preliminary Administrative Credential Preparation Program.*
- b) *Write and submit a Program Review document by December 2016 based on the new CTC accreditation model.*
- c) *Continue to develop the Higher Education, Administration, and Leadership (HEAL) master's degree pathway with a focus on developing HEAL as its own option within the Department of Educational Leadership.*
- d) *Continue work on the development of a new SOAP to reflect new student learning outcomes and assessments in alignment with newly adopted California Program Standards, Content Expectations and Performance Expectations for a Preliminary Administrative Credential Preparation Program and changes to the HEAL pathway.*

Ultimately, two SOAPs will be developed as the HEAL pathway becomes its own program option within the Department of Educational Leadership.

- e) Continue effective recruitment methods and expand and sustain strong district partnerships.*
- f) Implement, adjust and refine the foundation system developed for the Graduate Writing Competency for Educational Leaders bringing together both pathways (PreK-12 and HEAL).*
- g) By fall 2017, finalize the digital platform for EAD 298/Project with expected training of and use by all faculty advisers.*
- h) Develop a new student advisement survey and a digital system for student and faculty easy access to department and program policies, procedures, etc.*

Department of Literacy, Early, Bilingual, and Special Education

1. Report on previous years goals.

The Literacy, Early, Bilingual and Special Education department has grown in the past year. We currently have 23 full time faculty/full time lecturers. In 2015, we welcomed 8 new faculty into our department. The new faculty come from a variety of universities, UPenn, UC Davis, Claremont College to name a few. Our Special Education program grew the most with three new faculty. In addition to new faculty, we have some faculty retiring. This has also allowed us to rethink how we support each other across programs. We have addressed this goal by having monthly coordinator meetings. These meetings served to support programs, offer advice and assist each other in recruitment.

One of our goals this year was to recruit students. Precipitated by Dean Beare's call for increasing student numbers across programs, LEBSE made a conscious effort to recruit in all programs. As a result, the MME and Reading Program, collaborated in recruitment and shared spaces at recruitment events, visiting schools and in promotional materials. I allotted money for each program to develop colorful brochures and pamphlets. In 2016, the LEBSE department participated in the SaveMart Up the 99 recruitment fair, Vintage Days and we attempted to recruit at the library but due to conflicting schedules were unable to fulfill this task.

In the area of teaching, the department sought to improve the quality of instruction by completing peer evaluations, student evaluations, and updating our teaching by using technology. Many of our faculty are DISCOVERe fellows. My goal is to have all of our faculty DISCOVERe fellows by the fall of 2017. The need put our programs online has been a major goal for the faculty involved in the elementary credential program. As a result of this goal, faculty from SPED, Reading, Bilingual and Early Childhood are working on transitioning the first phase of the program online to be launched in 2017. We are also putting the Bilingual Authorization credential online. The department would like to continue addressing this goal by continuing to work on the online courses and continuing our participation in escholars.

Following the plan from the previous Chair, the department assigned faculty to peer evaluations of full time faculty and part-time faculty as well. Our goal is to make to sure all adjunct faculty administer their students evaluations except for a couple who did not do an online evaluation. We were able to fulfill this goal. In addition to fulfilling this goal, the department decided to reduce textbook spending for our students. As a result, the department won the Affordable Learning Solutions stipend in 2016. Approximately, eight faculty formally reduced the use of textbooks and incorporated affordable solutions for students. An additional six have committed to reduce costs for students starting in fall, 2016. LEBSE is involved in an ALS grant with Dr. Dennis Nef.

In the area of scholarship, the department increased publications due to more grants, assigned time and new faculty who entered the LEBSE department. There was an increase in scholarship due to new faculty entering our department and existing faculty published as well. For example, in the faculty report below it shows how we have improved in this area. Our faculty are committed to increasing scholarship by writing grants and increasing publications. Faculty in LEBSE are involved in Bechtel and UPenn Center for Minority Institutions grant. Three faculty in LEBSE are currently working on a Spencer grant with UPenn and another group submitted an additional Bechtel grant for fall, 2016.

In 2016, we conducted three searches in our LEBSE. Two resulted in hires who will be temporarily housed in LEBSE then moved in to the Liberal Studies department in 2017. The third search resulted in a choice yet the first choice did not accept the position due to personal matters. As a result, LEBSE will have two searches this fall. We will be conducting a search for a Reading/Bilingual faculty and for the Director of the Huggins Center. A LEBSE goal is to recruit more diverse faculty and focus our efforts in hiring faculty who have extensive teaching experience working with linguistically and culturally diverse children and faculty who work off a social justice lens.

LEBSE has undergone major changes. Increasing faculty yet also losing faculty due to faculty personal decisions, the resignation of the Department Administrative Assistant and now the hiring of our new DAA. This turnover did not affect the overall productivity of the department. We have to hire adjuncts to fill courses yet we are hiring new faculty. Our partnerships with neighboring districts are increasing so we are need of more faculty. LEBSE

faculty taught in many programs including First Year Experience and liberal studies. LEBSE is highly visible and accomplished at all levels.
