Freshmen

Requirements for Freshman Students:

- Earn a high school diploma or equivalent
- Complete the minimum 15-unit pattern a-g courses with a C or better in each course
- Take SAT or ACT
- Meet the minimum eligibility index (Use 10th and 11th grade a-g courses only for GPA)
 - SAT (sum of scores in math and critical reading) + (800 x high school GPA)
 - ACT (10 x ACT composite score without writing score) + (200 x high school GPA)

Fall Checklist

- Register to take SAT/ACT by **December 2017**
- Apply to Fresno State **October 1 - November 30**
- Send official SAT/ACT test scores by **February 2, 2018**
- Create your Fresno State email account once you receive your Letter of Acknowledgment
- Check your admission status at my.fresnostate.edu

Spring Checklist

- Submit all admission documents by **February 2, 2018**
- Attend Preview Day
- Accept your admission to Fresno State: **March 15 - May 1, 2018**
- Register and pay for Dog Days **March 15 - May 1, 2018**
- If required, register for the Early Start Program

Transfer

Requirements for upper division Transfer Students:

- 60 or more transferable semester units (90 quarter units)
- Foundation courses (Areas A1, A2, A3, & B4) with a grade of 'C-' or better
- Minimum cumulative GPA for the major a student chooses
- Minimum of 30 semester units (45 quarter units) of CSU General Education (GE)
- Must be in "good standing" at the last college attended. Good standing means student is eligible to re-enroll at that institution

Fall Checklist

- Meet with Transfer Counselor or Fresno State Recruitment Counselor
- Apply to Fresno State **October 1- November 30**
- Create your Fresno State email account once you receive your Letter of Acknowledgment
