**Prerequisites/Corequisites:** Other restrictions may apply. Please see your course catalog for detailed prerequisite/corequisite requirements.

**Grade Requirements:** CR/NC grading is not permitted in the Linguistics major. Students must maintain a B average in the Language Courses.

**Language Courses:** Consult with an advisor to determine placement in lower or upper division coursework. Literature courses in the language may be used with advisor permission. Except for LING 120, courses taught in English do not count toward the required courses for Plan A or Plan B. See your course catalog for detailed option requirements.

**General Education:** Units in this area may be used toward a double major or minor. Consult the appropriate department chair, program coordinator, or faculty adviser for further information.

**Electives (30 units):** Units in this area may be used toward a double major or minor. See advisor for a list of approved electives. Students must earn a minimum of 120 units total to graduate. The number of required elective units may vary, depending on the amount of units earned from major and GE courses.

**Upper Division Writing Skills requirement (UDWS):** All undergraduate students must demonstrate competency in writing skills by passing the Upper Division Writing Exam (UDWE) or by obtaining a C or better in an approved upper division writing course, identified by the letter "W."
